Board Resolution on the importance of science-based climate change policy to the management of Montana's wildlife and fish

Whereas global climate change is widely accepted by the scientific community and the broader public;

Whereas global climate change is an existential threat to life as we know it in the decades ahead;

Whereas a broad range of commitments to address the threats of climate change have been made by governments, corporations, nonprofits, and other organizations around the world;

Whereas the actions needed are sweeping in scope, time critical, expensive, and controversial; and

Whereas citizen engagement is essential to motivate government at all levels to address climate change scientifically and timely; now, therefore, be it resolved that the Montana Wildlife Federation (MWF):

- 1. Urges all levels of government to timely address climate change with science-based solutions.
- 2. Urges all levels of government to educate the public about the causes and threats of climate change.
- 3. Urges all levels of government to educate the public about solutions to climate change.
